Meg Kane established her public relations agency, Signature 57, in 2021. Its focus is on business and media strategy, stakeholder relations, and storytelling. She brings public relations skills, unique perspectives and real-world insights to local, national, and international corporate and non-profit organizations.

Pope Francis awarded Meg the Benemerenti Medal for service to the Church as co-lead of strategic communications for the 2015 World Meeting of Families and His Holiness' visit to Philadelphia.

She was strategic advisor to the Host Committee for the 2018 World Meeting of Families and Pope Francis' visits to Dublin and Knock, Ireland, and planned an event in Belfast commemorating the Good Friday Agreement.

Currently, Meg is CEO of Philadelphia Soccer 2026. She managed the successful bid that is bringing six World Cup matches, a 40-day Fan Festival, and 500,000+ visitors to Philadelphia in 2026.

KAREN HEPP

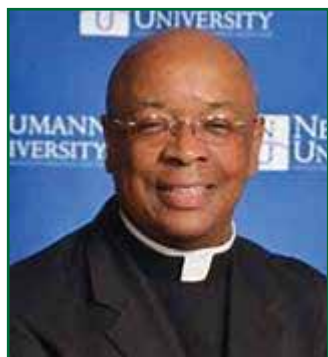
Once again our Toastmaster for this year's Communion Breakfast is Karen Hepp.

THIRTY - SIXTH ANNUAL HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Since 2011, the men inducted into the NECHS Hall of Fame have been enshrined at our Annual Communion Breakfast. On Sunday, April 6th 2025 the following men will join the Hall of Fame - They are: Bob Kelly, '81, Dennis Hill, '67, James Boylan, '70, Fr. Stephen Thorne, '86 and Michael Ferris, '82.



James Boylan, '70

Jim was a key player in the celebrated JV basketball game of 1968. He received the most votes for All-Catholic honors in 1970 and accepted a full scholarship to Villanova University. Jim was a highly regarded teacher and coach at Bishop Egan H.S. but changed careers after 6 years. For the next 36 years he worked in the healthcare industry for the clinical lab division of SmithKline, later acquired by Quest Diagnostics.

Early in his new career, he managed a regional 24-hour/day lab operation staff of 800 technicians, service and management employees. Later, he won the President's Club Award for leading a multi-year re-engineering project, critical to improving customer satisfaction and patient care. He served in senior leadership positions of increasing responsibility in sales, operations and general management prior to retiring as Executive Director of National Accounts.

Jim is a truly deserving inductee in the field of Business/Labor/Military.



Bob Kelly, '81

Bob is an Emmy Award winning broadcaster who has entertained people in the Delaware Valley for the past 30 years including his "Tailgate Takeover" on the jumbotron at Eagles games. He co-hosted the Philadelphia St. Patrick's Day parade for more than 15 years.

He joined the Fox 29 News team in October 2014 as a traffic reporter for "Good Day Philadelphia" and revolutionized TV traffic reporting with his high energy delivery and popular phrases like jammo, Conchy Curve and two jelly donut delay. Bob also hosts "Kelly Drives" a weekly half hour show introducing new or interesting places in the Philadelphia area.

So it is truly fitting that we induct Bob in the field of Arts/Entertainment/Education.



Dennis W. Hill, '67 (Posthumous)

Dennis had careers in the Philadelphia Police Department's communications center and as a Public Safety Supervisor at the University of Pennsylvania. His love, however, was basketball on the playgrounds, as a freshman at North and as a scholarship player at Ohio Dominican University.

For many years he coached youth basketball, was the Executive Director of the respected Markward Basketball Club and Selection Chair for the Philadelphia All Star Labor Classic while tirelessly raising scholarships for aspiring student athletes.

After graduation, Mike attended Pierce College and then Drexel University, where he began his career as an IT professional.

President's Message by

James F. Kelly, '70

Dear Falcon Brothers and Supporters,

I wish everyone a belated Merry Christmas and I hope you are enjoying a Happy, Healthy, and Prosperous New Year!

The beginning of the new calendar year corresponds with the middle of the Alumni Association's fiscal year (July 1 through June 30). January and February are very busy months for the Alumni office staff and volunteers. Here is a quick overview of what the Association's Board of Governors / your Class Representatives are doing.

The 37th Falconway Drive, which supports the Alumni Association Memorial Scholarship Fund and the Oblate Development Fund, is well underway and donations are being processed daily. Early returns once again show the generosity of the dedicated alumni and friends of the North Catholic community. Unfortunately, the donations over the last several years have not covered the annual \$500,000 of scholarship grants awarded. The resulting deficits require that the Trustees of the Scholarship Fund withdraw funds from investment accounts to cover any shortfall.

The investment plan was established by the founders of the Scholarship Fund in 1968. Donations from the founders were the seed money for the Fund and contributions from generous donors, like you, helped the endowment grow and make investments to ensure that funds for future scholarship recipients are available. Those responsible for making investments have been very diligent, their investment strategies have been conservative, successful and forward thinking but the investment accounts are not bottomless. Due to the dwindling number of alumni, donations to the Fund have been falling. A review of the Obituaries listed in recent editions of the Falconer, and the fact that there have been no new Alumni since the school closed in 2010, are factors that have led to the decline in donations to the Scholarship Fund. The Trustees are exploring additional options for donating to the Fund, without changing the present investment plan structure or affecting the investment plan accounts.

In addition to processing donations, the office staff has been receiving, analyzing and answering requests for scholarship applications for the 2025/2026 school year. The online application process has made the application request and submittal processes easier for applicants, and, as a result, we have received record numbers of requests and corresponding applications.

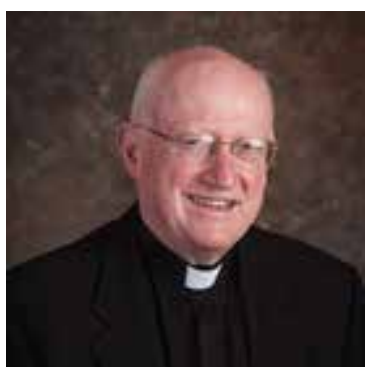

Chaplain's Corner

Dear NECHS Alumni,
How important do you think you are? Do you believe that you are entitled to special treatment? No matter which way you answer, consider the following story.

A small private plane was flying with three passengers on board: an old priest, a rich businessman, and a boy scout. Suddenly, the engine sputtered and stopped altogether. They all rushed to get their parachutes. They were horrified to realize that there were not enough parachutes for all of them. One of them will be left without one. The pilot took one, saying, "I have a wife and two kids. They need me." And off he jumped. The businessman, seeing that the boy was holding a parachute, grabbed it away from him, and said, "I am a very important person in this world; I must not die!" And putting the straps on his shoulders, he quickly jumped off of the plane. Only the priest and the boy were left on the plane. The priest told the boy, "Son, take the last parachute. I am old, and I have no family. I am ready to leave this world. You are still young and have a great future. Save your life." The boy, with a naughty smile, said, "Do not worry, Father. There are still two parachutes left. The 'very important man in the world' just jumped out wearing my backpack."

Perhaps you would have felt justified in taking what you thought was the only way out, reasoning that it is "every man/woman for himself/herself."

Are you open to considering alternate morals to this story?

A pragmatic moral would be, "Never be too quick to act in a stressful situation without first making sure you have the right tools." Indeed, our 'very important man in the world' did not take the time to determine the difference between a parachute and a backpack. These items covered in canvas might appear similar but are very different in function.

An altruistic (Christian) moral would consider the welfare of others and then allow himself to be surprised. The 'very important man in the world' did not think the priest or the boy scout would have offered to stay on the troubled plane. In so thinking, he would not allow generosity or self-sacrifice any room to manifest itself.

Our world has a mixture of pragmatists and altruistic individuals. The pragmatist finds it challenging to understand the value of the sacrifice Jesus offered for us. The altruistic person continues to trust in God and knows the inherent cost of being a follower of Jesus Christ. We attempt to comfort ourselves by saying no one is totally one or the other. Yet, we know a proper balance is difficult to achieve.

St. Francis DeSales teaches us to err on the side of charity.

"I hear of nothing but perfection on every side, so far as the talk goes, but I see very few people who really practice it. Everybody has his own notion of perfection. One man thinks that it lies in the cut of his clothes, another in fasting, a third in almsgiving, or in frequenting the Sacraments, in meditation, in some special gift of contemplation or in extraordinary gifts or graces; - but they are all mistaken, as it seems to me, because they confuse the means, or the results, with the cause. For my part, the only perfection I know is a hearty love of God, and to love one's neighbor as oneself. Without these, there can be no real perfection. Charity is the only 'bond of perfectness' between Christians, the only virtue which rightly unites us to God and man. Such union is our final aim and end, and all else is mere delusion."

Sgt. John J. McVeigh from the class of 1939, was awarded the Medal of Honor, posthumously, after being killed in action on April 6th, 1945 in Brest France during WWII. Sgt. McVeigh was killed after saving his platoon, who were pin-down by rifle fire from the Germans, and single-handedly charged the attacking Germans with his only weapon, a trench knife and killed 1 German and advanced on three more of the enemy when he was shot down and killed at pointblank range. As a result, his rifle platoon was able to reorganize and hold the high ground and close the line. This year our Communion Breakfast is celebrated on the 80th anniversary of his death so please remember the McVeigh family in your prayers and the sacrifice he made for all of us.

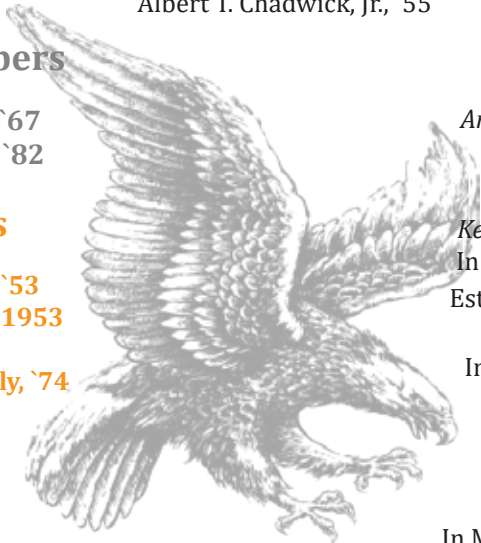
