Scholarship Fund Announces Recipients of 2023 Grants

It is difficult to imagine our world without a Northeast Catholic High School for Boys in Philadelphia. Yet here we are. Oh yes, at one time our alma mater was new and inviting. It opened in 1926 and welcomed the vast throngs of prospective students from all corners of the city. We watched it bloom and grow over the years reaching 5,000 all male students in one year in the mid 1950's.

Again, hard to imagine from that height of abundance and through all of the ups and downs of world events, North continued to survive and thrive even with a World War and the Korean Conflict when so many students and clergy volunteered or were called to do their duty for God and country.

We fast forward to more recent times, and while we are beyond the conflict of Vietnam we remember those alumni we have lost. honor those wounded and scared, and the many returning to make their way in life contributing to our society and caring for their families.

It is somewhat ironic that today, in 2023, we the alumni brothers of North Catholic, have virtually lost all physical signs of our school's existence. What was once a symbol of greatness, success and accomplishments of its student body, championship sports teams and scholarly achievements.

Basically all gone except for some trophies and the memories we carry within us.

The irony is that the North Catholic alumni has put forth a massive effort starting in 1968 to raise money to help sustain Catholic education at all levels starting in the Philadelphia area expanding outward and into New Jersey. We are helping families and students financially to insure that the Catholic teachings and traditions continue. We are closed, yet we continue to work and contribute as if Northeast Catholic is still alive and present. I guess you can say it is. The things we were taught, the battles we won, and the spirit that was North Catholic is instilled in all of us now living.

It is kind of fitting. As our motto states " I have taken hold and will not let go". Words to live by.

As of April 30th, due to the generosity of our alumni and Friends, Falconway collected \$157,730.00. The Memorial Scholarship Fund collected \$123,657 and the Oblate Development Fund has \$34,073.

At this time last year, Falconway had collected \$138,905. The Memorial Scholarship Fund collected \$108,728 and The Oblate Development Fund has \$30,236. Thank you so much for your support. It is the Alumni like you that help us keep the Scholarship Fund giving grants to students that support Catholic education and the Oblates of St. Francis deSales.



Our Fellow Falcons are quite an accomplished group. They have lived full & productive lives with many successes in their chosen fields. A number of them served in the military, then went into their employment, raised a family and retired. The thread that bound them together is the positive difference they made in their communities. Northeast Philadelphia road renamed in honor of SWAT officer killed in line of duty

A stretch of Knights Road in Northeast Philadelphia has been renamed for a police officer who was killed in the line of duty in 2020.

The Sgt. James O'Connor IV Memorial Highway was unveiled Friday, located between Woodhaven and Frankford avenues. His wife, Terri O'Connor, called it a touching tribute.

"The sign is beautiful," she said. "I drive down this road every day, so it's a beautiful memory in his honor."

Sgt. O'Connor, `92, a Philadelphia SWAT officer, was shot and killed on the morning of March 13, 2020, while serving a high-risk warrant. Terri O'Connor said they were one month shy of celebrating their 25th wedding anniversary together.

On Friday, June 2, 2023 at 12 pm in front of Our Lady of Calvary Catholic Church located at 11024 Knights Rd., a Memorial Service was conducted with family members in honor of renaming of Knights Road to Sgt. James O'Connor IV Memorial Highway. State Representative Ed Neilson was also in attendence.
